

dino dig - homemade



You can buy dino dig kits but making your own is easy with good planning. You need a few things but not much. Corn-flour or Corn Starch if you are in USA. You also need water and a bowl to mix it. Then all you need are small plastic dinosaur toys and small containers to pour over the mixture and set the toys in to a plaster type material that can be dug off with metal or hard plastic tools. You might use an old spoon for safe but effective scaping and breaking of the plaster. Add in a paint brush for dino digging fun.

Recipe:

2 cups of corn flour plus 1 cup of water to make your mixture. Mixture needs to be stirred in to a thick soup consistency.

Put small dino toys in containers. Cover completely with mixture. Leave to set in warm dry place for 2 to 3 days. Then you are ready to dig.

JELLY OPTION - GREAT FOR VERY YOUNG RANGERS



This is a much quicker overnight option.

Follow instructions make jelly.

Make Jelly mixture as normal with boiling water.

After 1 hour of cooling time - add the dinosaur toys and put in the fridge to set overnight.

If you use small bowls you can make these as individual food and playing fun. Although, maybe just stick to the playing bit - as eating jelly with hands is not highly recommended.

To make the task harder - you can even freeze your jelly mixture. Careful though to allow for expansion in freezer - so maybe avoid glass bowls in the freezer.
